

Description of the final exam for Latin 101

Spring 2003

Monday May 5th, 2-5 p.m. in our regular classroom (be at least 5 minutes early!)

Estimated duration: 1.5 – 2 hours

You are responsible for all information contained in Wheelock Chs. 1-34 plus *fio, eo*, and jussive noun clauses (ch. 36). Paradigms and stand-alone parsing Ids and vocabulary will be pulled only from Chs. 21-34. As always, material for sentences will be drawn from all chapters.

The exam will be formatted as follows:

- I. Decline/Conjugate the following paradigms (~10%)
- II. Vocabulary: Give one English equivalent for each of the following words. (From Wheelock Vocab.) (~10%)
- III. Identifications: Translate the short sentences and fill in the correct type of subjunctive or conditional. (~10%)
- IV. Translation with grammar and morphology questions.
 - a. Take home (~35%): you are required to submit a parsing sheet and **TYPED** translation of “The Helvetians Parley With Caesar” from Groton and May before receiving a copy of the final exam. The parsing sheet will be distributed on the final day of class. You cannot take the final if you do not submit this translation and parsing sheet. You may use your textbook, notebook, and/or workbook for this section of the exam. But your work must be your own. Collaboration will result in an immediate 0 on the entire final and official action for violation of the Honor Code.
 - b. In-class (~35%): one or two continuous prose passages that I will find or compose, with notes for any vocabulary or grammar not covered in Wheelock. This will be a passage you have not seen before.

Given the scope of the material being covered, consideration will be made for forgetting a word here or there (i.e. do 10 of 11, with the 11th for extra credit); you may ask one ANSWER during the course of the exam, and there will be ample opportunity to secure bonus credit.

I will be available by appointment on Wednesday and Friday afternoon and Monday before the exam. With the exception of this week’s drill sessions, Elizabeth will be incommunicado for the remainder of the semester.
