

Description of the final exam for Latin 101

Fall 2002

Thursday Dec. 19, 2-5 p.m. in our regular classroom (be at least 5 minutes early!)

Estimated duration: 1.5 – 2 hours

You are responsible for all information contained in Wheelock Chs. 1-20.

The exam will be formatted as follows:

- I. Vocabulary: Give one English equivalent for each of the following words. (From Wheelock Vocab.)
- II. Parse the follow forms, giving all possibilities. (i.e. a mini-parsing sheet)
- III. Give the dictionary entry for each of the following words
- IV. Decline/Conjugate the following paradigms
- V. Translation
 - a. Take home: you are required to submit a **TYPED** translation of “The Labors of Hercules” from Groton and May before receiving a copy of the final exam. You cannot take the final if you do not submit this translation. You may use your textbook, notebook, and/or workbook for this section of the exam. But your work must be your own. Collaboration will result in an immediate 0 on the entire final and official action for violation of the Honor Code.
 - b. In-class:
 - i. Sentences –
 1. a few sentences identical or very similar to those you have seen in the workbook exercises.
 2. Transforming active to passive sentences.
 - ii. one or two continuous prose passages that I will find or compose, with notes if there is any vocabulary or grammar that you do not know. There will be a set of grammar and morphology questions on the passages.

Given the scope of the material being covered, consideration will be made for forgetting a word here or there (i.e. do 10 of 11, with the 11th for extra credit), you may ask one ANSWER during the course of the exam, and there will be amply opportunity for secure bonus credit.
