Periodical Review Assignments

Over the semester you will be assigned to read 4 articles from 4 different Ceramics periodicals held in the library. Do not use articles from the same periodicals. My favorites are Ceramics Art & Perception, Studio Potter, Ceramics Monthly, and Ceramics Technical. You can check out these periodicals from the librarians behind the main circulation desk as you first enter the library. The periodicals cannot leave the library. You will need a minimum of a photo I.D. and your student #. It would be best to have a student I.D. that can serve as your library card otherwise the librarians will issue a library card.

What to read.

- Check out a recent periodical, no older than 2005. Thumb through the periodicals that you checked out. Hopefully you will see work that interests you. Read the accompanying article. Do not choose to review the brief articles found in the front of the magazine such as the *Up Front* section of Ceramics Monthly. Read one of the longer main articles in the publication.

What to write.

1. Write down the *author, article title, periodical, and issue # if given, date, and page numbers*. It is not necessary to cite the article in the exact MLA style shown below, as long as all the necessary information is listed.
 - a. **Example:** Welch, Adam. "Minimalism and Ceramics: The Sculptural Perplex of Brian Harper." Ceramics Art and Perception 63, March-May 2006: 53-57.
2. Give a brief summary of the article. Tell me what the article is about.
3. Tell me what you think of the work or article. Do you like the work/article? Why? Do you agree with opinions of the author?
4. What did you learn from the article?

How much to write.

- One typed page is sufficient if all the above is completed. This assures me that you read the article.
