

# CCSCC / CIR Autocross School

April 5, 2008 at the Rantoul Aviation Center

CCSCC, in cooperation with CIR is offering an autocross school on Saturday, April 5, 2008 to be held at the Rantoul Aviation Center in Rantoul Illinois. There will be both a beginners' class and an experienced class. Experienced autocross instructors will be teaching the class and will also act as individual instructors for in-car instruction. There will be enough instructors available so that we hope to have a ratio of no more than 2 students per instructor. There will be lots of practice time for all entrants.

## Schedule:

### *Saturday, April 5*

8:30 am: Beginners classroom instruction begins and advanced course starts on the autocross site.

11:30 am: Lunch for all entrants, instructors and workers in the classroom

12:30 pm: Beginners, driving instructors and advanced students report to the autocross site. Advanced students will work the course and help beginners learn the course.

CCSCC workers' class starts in the classroom

2:00 CCSCC workers' class ends. CCSCC workers report to autocross site to take over running the event. Advanced students get more instruction

4:30 pm Wrap-up in the classroom for all students, instructors and workers.

### *Sunday, April 6*

8:30 am: Workers and instructors report to the autocross site Set up event including tech inspection (year long tech), registration, timing and scoring

9:00 am: Registration and technical inspection opens

10:00 am: SSS / SS class in the classroom

10:30 am: registration closes -- NO LATE REGISTRATION!!!

11 am: Technical inspection closes. Drivers' meeting.

11:15 am (or so): First Run commences

4 pm: End of runs

You must pre-register and pay to participate in either the beginner or advanced course. You may pre-register by email to [farquasi@mac.com](mailto:farquasi@mac.com). A slot will be reserved for you, but you must pay by March 25 to get a slot. Check by mail or PayPal will be accepted. Please make check out to "CCSCC" or send PayPal payment to [farquasi@mac.com](mailto:farquasi@mac.com). You may mail checks and registration forms to Barry Rowe, 3702 Glenn Brooke Rd, Champaign, IL 61822. You may cancel and get a refund up until March 25. There may be an online registration form available. A registration form is attached. If you are under 18, you must register by the 15 of March, so we can get waivers to you in time for the school. Minor waivers must be notarized unless, at least 1 parent shows up at the school or a CCSCC member witnesses the waiver signing

The cost is \$75 per beginner and there is a limit of 30 entrants for the beginners' class. The cost is \$50 per advanced entrant and there is a limit of 15 entrants for the

advanced course. Entrants will get free entrance to the TestNTune held the next day, as well as workers and instructors. The advanced class will be in 2 groups, while one group runs the other works. The advanced class will also work the afternoon session for the beginning class. If you don't want to do this, don't sign up.

At the TestNTune, the group of entrants will be divided into heats (probably three). Each entrant will work 1 heat and can run during 2 heats. No times will be recorded, so the entrant has the responsibility of recording his own times if he wishes. There will be no time between heats as such. When the end of a heat is announced, the people in line will run and as they finish they will be expected to replace people running the next heat in their work locations. Safety and security are most important and there will be some Safety Stewards present who will make sure the event, the pits, and observation areas are safe and secure.

On Sunday Morning, a class will be held for people who want to become an SCCA Solo Safety Steward (SSS) or the CCSCC equivalent Safety Steward (SS). The class will be at 10 am in the classroom. There is no cost, but expect to stay around all day to act as SS at the event. Please register early so you may receive the written materials to study (well.. read) before the class. To become an SSS you will need to be an assistant SSS at two events before you get your license. The TestNTune will not count as one so you will need to work two SCCA events to get your license. To become an SS for CCSCC, you will need to work the TestNTune or another event to get your license.
