Erigeron annuus

Description: Hairy and leafy, with leaves strongly toothed. The hairs lie close to the stem. The flowers resemble small daisies, each with 40-100 white rays with a yellow center.

Distribution: Canada south through Florida, west to Utah-Minnesota border, then recurring on the west coast.

Habitats: Fields, roadsides, wastelands.
