FACT SHEET

The new Children's Hospital – Aurora, Colorado

- ◆ The Children's Hospital (TCH) founded – 1908
- ◆ 2007 ranking by US News & World Report – No. 4 in the Nation
- ◆ Largest Single Donor – Scottish Rite Foundation of Colorado
- ◆ Scottish Rite Foundation donations to TCH since 1953 – about \$20 million
- ◆ Number of Endowed Chairs (as of November 1, 2007) – 21
- ◆ Kelley Family/Schlessman Family Scottish Rite Masons Chair in Childhood Language Disorders
 - Established February 2003 (50th anniversary year of the Scottish Rite Foundation)
 - 7th Chair established at TCH
 - Value of Chair at time of establishment was \$2 million
- ◆ Number of hospital employees – 3,500
- ◆ Number of hospital volunteers – 1,800
- ◆ Number of doctors serving TCH – 900
- ◆ Number of nurses serving TCH – 1,100
- ◆ Inpatient admissions in 2006 – 9,941 --- Outpatient visits in 2006 – 343,328
- ◆ Ground Breaking for new TCH – June 10, 2004
- ◆ Masonic Cornerstone laid – October 7, 2006
- ◆ Architect – ZGF; Construction Company – joint venture of Phipps/McCarthy
- ◆ Projected Cost - \$534 million
- ◆ Inpatients Relocated – September 29, 2007
- ◆ Department of Audiology, Speech Pathology, and Learning Services
 - staffed by 70 professionals
 - a national leader in treating pediatric speech-language disorders
 - specialties recognized include: pediatric audiology services, augmentative communication, family-centered speech therapy, dyslexia and learning services
- ◆ TCH research specialties – Cystic Fibrosis, Pulmonary Hypertension, Experimental Therapeutics, and Liver Transplants and Disorders.



- ▶ **The Scottish Rite Foundation of Colorado completed 54 years of service in 2007**
\$25.4 million was spent on speech-language services between 1953 and 2007 - \$1.4 million in 2007.
- ▶ **21 Colorado communities were served by RiteCare Clinics/Centers operated by 11 RiteCare partners - University of Colorado at Boulder becoming a new partner in 2007.**
- ▶ **12,845 children have been served to date.**
