Information for the Major League, National League,
American League and T-ball League



To the Parents and Fans of Rye Little Leaguers:

Welcome to the 2008 baseball season! Volunteers have been busy managing and coaching teams, ordering equipment, organizing snack shack operations, fund raising, maintaining the fields, etc. Work started back in January to get ready for this season. We have 176 children playing on 16 teams in four levels of baseball (Majors, National, American, and T-Ball).

As in the past, there are several ways you can help us during the season and during the games:

- the Visiting Team is responsible for assigning a parent to the scorer's booth to operate the scoreboard and PA system.
- If your child plays any games on the major league field (Majors / Nationals), you will be put in a rotation of families to take your turn operating the snack shack.
- For the minor league games, parents will be asked to help with umpiring.
- For all levels of play we ask your help in enforcing several rules and please review with your child:
 1. Players are to wear their uniforms at all games, shirts tucked in. Jewelry is not permitted.
 2. There are to be NO BATS in the spectator area. Please keep personally owned baseball bats in your cars, away from spectators, until your child's team is ready to take the field. If bats are around, children will swing them. This is a serious safety (and insurance) problem. Similarly, there should be no playing catch in the spectator area.
 3. Children are not to be inside the scorer's booth unless an adult has asked a child for assistance.
 4. Bikes are not to be ridden in the spectator area. Bicycles may be walked across the spectator area to be placed in the bike rack.
 5. No food is to be brought into the dugouts at any time. Only chewing gum and water or sports drinks in plastic bottles are permitted in the dugouts.
 6. Players are to remain in the dugouts or on the playing field at all times during a game. To leave the field / dugout area, a player must request permission from the manager, who must notify the umpire.
 7. Only the team's manager, coaches and players are allowed in and around the dugout.
 8. FYI, Rye Little League incorporates a 10 run rule into play. If a team is leading by 10 runs or more after four and a half innings of play, the game is over and they are declared the winner.

Thank you for your continued cooperation. A Little League season shows just how effectively volunteers can work together to run a fairly complex operation. If you, as a parent, have any issues or questions regarding Rye's baseball program, please do not hesitate to contact a Board Member. Enjoy the season.

Minor League - 2008 National League Rules

Regular Little League rules with the following exceptions:

1. No stealing. No leading off base.
2. One base on an overthrow.
3. Each player may play a maximum of three innings at the same position per game.
4. Players will pitch to the opposing team. There are no walks. After 4 balls, coach will pitch.
5. An umpire will call strikes (no walks).
6. The home team is responsible for providing an umpire.
7. Innings end with the third out. If a team goes through the entire batting line up in one inning with fewer than two outs, then the umpire will announce that there are automatically two outs. The inning must end on a natural third out.
8. All players on the team roster will be in the batting lineup at all times.
9. All games will be five innings unless called by darkness, weather, or 1¹/₂ hour in length. (Games end with a complete inning).
10. There may be unlimited substitutions in the defensive lineup and each player must play a minimum of six outs.
11. Male catcher must wear a protective cup. Players must be in uniform: Caps and shirts (no shorts).

Rain Outs: Coaches to determine if field is suitable for play. Rainouts can be made up on Friday nights if agreed to by both coaches.

Rye Little League Snack Shack

The Rye Little League Snack Sack is a fund raising venture for the Rye Little League. It is run solely by parent volunteers. Every family with a child playing in the Major Leagues (Saturday morning games) and National Leagues (Saturday afternoon games) is asked to take a turn running the snack shack. A schedule has been prepared, based on the two teams playing and each family taking turns.

Please find your name and the dates that you are scheduled to run the snack shack. If you are unable to work the shack on your scheduled date, it is up to **YOU** to find a replacement. It is easiest if you switch with another family from your child's team; make sure you note the change on the schedule in the snack shack and notify Beth Kendall of the change. You can hire an older child (age 12 and up) to work the shift for you, if you want to be in the stands for the game. If you hire someone, it is your responsibility to pay that person each time he/she works for you. Please be sure to notify the other adult scheduled to work as **there must be at least one adult in the shack at all times**. Both scheduled adults cannot hire a student to work the same shift.

You are scheduled as either the "Opener" or the "Closer". Both adults on the schedule work the entire shift, including set-up and clean-up. The Opener picks the cash box, as directed, 45 minutes before game time. Both people scheduled to work should be at the Snack Shack about 30 minutes before game time. The Closer returns the cash box, as directed, after clean-up is complete. **If you hire a student to work your shift, you are still responsible for the Opening or Closing duties.**

If there is a cancellation for your scheduled game, or if it is rescheduled, you are still responsible for working the shack on the make up / rescheduled date.

If you are a "No-Show" for your scheduled shift, you will be assigned additional shifts during the play-offs.

We will need additional volunteers to run the shack during the play-off games in June. You will be contacted once the schedule is made.

Snack Shack Opening Procedure

1. Pick up the cash box as directed.
2. Unlock the bathrooms
3. Make sure the trash barrels have bags that are the right size so they don't fall inside.
4. Start the coffee
 - Fill the pots to the 12 cup level
 - one regular and one decaf – also one pot of hot water for hot chocolate or tea.
5. Start the hot dogs
 - Pour 2 full coffee pots of hot water in the bottom of the steamer
 - Start with about 16 hot dogs
 - Leave the buns in their plastic bag by the open end so some steam gets to them
 - Keep an eye on the buns, they can get mushy if in there too long before being eaten
6. Picnic Table
 - Set out ketchup, mustard, relish, cream / sugar for coffee, napkins
7. Set out assorted candy and snacks.
8. Pizza Delivery – Rye General Store
 - Should arrive at 5:45 p.m. on weeknights, 11:30 a.m. on Saturdays
9. Return cash box as directed.

Snack Shack Closing Procedure

- Empty and clean coffee pots. Coffee machine stays plugged in, make sure the burners are off.
- Drain and clean hot dog machine – all parts are removable and should be washed and put back.
- Be sure all electric appliances are unplugged or turned off.
- Cover and put away candy and snacks.
- Put ketchup, mustard, relish and cream back in the refrigerator.
- Restock soda, Powerade and water in both refrigerators.
- Leftover sub sandwiches remain in the refrigerator.
- Wipe counters and picnic table and wash utensils.
- Sweep the floor.
- Empty trash barrels and place trash in the dumpster.
- Cans / bottles to be recycled should be brought to the recycling container by the dumpster.
- Keep track of needed supplies and leave the list on the counter.
- Straighten up / sweep the bathrooms and lock the bathroom doors.
- Place long metal pole across inside of snack shack window and padlock the front of the window.
- Turn out the snack shack lights.
- Lock door to the snack shack.
