

## Language Arts Plan Literature

**All courses except American Lit are 1 semester long.**  
(Please read the course descriptions for more specific details about the courses.)

None of these courses have prerequisites.

<b>Anthology Based Courses</b>	
These 2 courses are alternated with only one being offered each year. Non-sequential. The combination of these 2 courses covers most of the literary elements, which will be referred to in college	
Literature: Key Elements	Literature: Style & Techniques
This course is based on one of Bob Jones' Literature Texts and covers the big picture elements necessary to understand and interpret all literature.	This course is based on another of Bob Jones' Literature Texts and covers the intricate details of an author's stylistic elements, all of which help reveal the subtle techniques used, thereby allowing an author to move beyond mere writing, into the ability to create great pieces of literature.

<b>Full Length Literary Based Courses, Level I</b>	
These 2 courses are alternated with only one being offered each year. Non-sequential.	
Literature: Great Books A	Literature Great Books B
This course has a set of 5 full length books, which are covered in depth with supplemental study guides. Students are expected to read one additional work outside class and give a presentation on it at the end of the semester.	This course has a different set of 5 full length books, which are covered in depth with supplemental study guides. Students are expected to read one additional work outside class and give a presentation on it at the end of the semester.

<b>Full Length Literary Based Course, Level II</b>
This course is recommended for grades 9-12
Literature: Great Books C
This course is geared towards upper classmen. There is an expectation that students are willing to enter into critical thinking and analytical discussions. It is an excellent course in preparation for college courses. Students study 4 full-length books in-depth without supplemental study guides. Students are expected to read one additional work outside class and give a presentation on it at the end of the semester.

<b>Literature: American</b>
This course is offered every other year and is recommended for grades 9-12
This course is based on Bob Jones' American Literature textbook and takes a year to complete because of the breadth of the material to be surveyed. This course looks at many authors during each era of our country's history, how history affects literature, and how literature reflects the culture in which it is written.
