Topics you may include in your Country Reports

1. Environmental problems in your country. What causes them? What is being done about them? What can be done about them?
2. What are the strengths and possible problems of the political and economic systems in your country?
3. What social problems does your country face? What is being done?
4. What is your country's involvement and opinion of such international organizations as the United Nations, International Red Cross, NATO or other security alliances, and Amnesty International?
5. Be prepared to describe a typical day in the life of a teenager in your country.
6. Be prepared to describe holidays, traditions, values and belief systems of the country in which you live.
7. Be prepared to describe family life in your country such as holiday celebrations, leisure time activities, vacations, customs and traditions surrounding birth, dating customs, marriage and death. What do teenagers do for recreation? What role does religion play in family life?
8. Also be prepared to share your vision and concerns about the future; and some of your personal goals in life.
9. How are conflicts settled in your culture, family, and country?
10. Be prepared to teach others how to say important words and phrases in your country's language so that other participants could survive as tourists in your country.
11. Also be prepared to ask questions of everyone else in the Institute. What do you want to learn, experience or observe as a participant in the Institute?
