

1. All tests are online and last for one hour.
2. You may take the tests anywhere: in College, at the Faculty—anywhere you can get online.
3. For the Greek tests, you will be expected to type Greek (no accents or breathings required—see separate sheet on ‘How to type in Greek’ available at [tinyurl.com](http://tinyurl.com) address below): **be sure to figure this out before you start a Greek test.**
4. Each test is unique: some elements (e.g. vocabulary) are randomized.
5. The computer records how much time you spend on a test—please do not use dictionaries and grammars, etc.
6. The tests do not factor towards any kind of cumulative grade or anything of that kind.
7. All students are expected to take the termly Greek tests: check with your DoS and language instructor for arrangements.
8. If Greek letters do not appear correctly on your browser, **you may need to set your browser’s text encoding to Unicode**: there should be an option in the View menu to do this; you may also get better results on different browsers.
