



# Anthropology Scholarship Application Rio Hondo College



## Requirements

Two scholarships are available each year, one for the fall term and one for the spring term. In order to be eligible, students must be enrolled in at least one anthropology class at Rio Hondo College and must have successfully completed at least six units of anthropology classes by the end of the term for which the application is submitted. For example, a student who completed Anthropology 101 during an earlier term and is currently taking Anthropology 102 would be eligible.

In order to apply, students must submit this application to Dr. Adam Wetsman (Science 320F) by November 14 for the fall term and by April 3 for the spring term. Letters of recommendation and Rio Hondo College scholarship applications are not required. If some anthropology classes were taken at a school other than Rio Hondo College, then transcripts must be included. Students may apply for the scholarship more than once, however, a new application must be submitted each term.

- 1) Number of anthropology classes taken or currently taking at Rio Hondo College
- 2) Grades in anthropology classes
- 3) Overall grade point average
- 4) Information submitted on this application form
