Using what are called augmented reality technologies, this project described in this seminar aims to bridge the technology gap while examining the cultural biases inherent within new media technologies in order to re-purpose them to serve Indigenous applications and protocols. It will create a land-based “living library” by using an xml design format in which media files are GPS encoded in such a way that media files are playable only within a certain proximity to a site.
